
#### **Library Activities:**

**Darby History Detectives** met on June 24 and discussed "The Curious Case if Allen Rickets", led by Herold Finnigan. Eight adults attended.




**Summer Reading Kick off** June 28, 2022 "Mr. Q" entertained 85 children and 18 Adults at Walnut Elementary School.

State Aid: The state has changed the application to be awarded the State Aid. I was concerned about our spending for library materials and received this message from Delaware County Libraries.

If you take a look at the <u>Standards for</u>

<u>MEMBER LIBRARIES</u> (pages 3 and 4), the

Collection Expenditure standard is "Each
member library must spend twice the amount of the
previous year's Equal Distribution Grant for library
materials." which was \$4176.74, which DA exceeded.

When it comes to State Aid, the 12% is only an overall system requirement, not something an individual library would request a waiver for.

From The System: County Council awarded a contract for an evaluation of the library system to Rethinking Libraries, LLC (RTL). RTL is tasked with evaluating the current model for the provision of library services and the information and library needs of Delaware County residents, as well as



developing comprehensive recommendations for delivering those services equitably and economically in the future.

The evaluation includes onsite visits and interviews with each member library. Please review the description of these visits from the RTL contract:

A team from RTL will interview internal stakeholders and review facilities, programs, services and collections at each member library. We provide an agenda for staff before and expect to spend approximately 4-8 hours at each library. A greater understanding of each community will be gained during these visits that will be enhanced by our demographic analysis. As part of this process, local community leaders and library stakeholders can be gathered for an hour-long engagement session. We can give guidance on who might attend; however, it is the library's responsibility to invite interested parties.

Prior to their onsite visits, RTL will conduct two **pre-visit webinars** to set expectations surrounding the visits, particularly with regard to information needed and outcomes desired. The workshops will be 60 minutes and all libraries should have a representative at one or both to gain insight and understanding into the project and what will happen when the team visits.

The RTL team will be in at our library on September 27.

At the conclusion of the evaluation, each library will receive a

At the conclusion of the evaluation, each library will receive a comprehensive report including a scorecard, recommendations to meet PA state aid standards (where needed), summaries, key takeaways, and full data sets.

The deliverables of this evaluation will provide Delaware County Council with a clearer picture of services and funding so these visits are your opportunity to have your voice heard and be part of the process.




