Streets Resurfacing

Council asked about the ability to resurface a section of Moore St. The segment in question, between Chestnut and Walnut Sts., is not currently a Liquid Fuels-eligible street within the Borough. We have measured it, and it is compliant to the width requirement. In order to have it added to the Borough's street listing, we will need to prove that the Borough accepted a deed of dedication. To date, we have not been able to find anything. To resurface this segment without demonstrating ownership means General Funds must be used. An estimate is \$10,250 for 1 ½" milling and resurfacing.

PennDOT has identified streets that are not currently on the Borough's liquid fuels listing. They are asking if we wish to pursue having them added. They include: Coventry Avenue, Londonderry Lane, Shetland Road, Glen Cove Road and Keystone Avenue. If the Borough maintains these roadways, we can pursue having them added to the approved listing, so we receive liquid fuels tax monies for them in the future. Please advise.

Pedestrian trolley bridge

The structural engineer has inspected the pedestrian bridge and we are awaiting his report.

CDBG – 2016 Golf Road Infrastructure Improvements

The preconstruction meeting was held on December 15. The contractor intends to begin work April 24, 2017, weather permitting.

CDBG - 2017 Application

County Council announced the CDBG awards and the Borough has a contingent award for the soccer field. The limitation is that nothing can be constructed in a floodplain so there is a possibility it will not be deemed eligible.

MS4 Separate Storm Sewer Permit

In order to complete the requirements for Year 4 of the permit, we will need information to be provided by the Borough. We will resend the request to the Manager.

MS4 Good Housekeeping Training will be held on April 20, from 9:00 - 11:00 am, in the Community Room at the Yeadon Borough Hall for Borough employees.

We have started working on the Notice of Intent to renew the MS4 Permit and the Pollution Reduction Plan that must be submitted with the NOI. The new MS4 permit application needs to be completed by Aug. 3 so it can be open to the public for comment for 30 days before it is submitted in September to DEP.

Please note that the Darby Town Center and the Darby Fire Co. No. 1 have not submitted inspection and maintenance reports as required by their Land Development approvals. The Borough will be held responsible for the non-compliance. It is suggested the Borough send a letter reminding these owners of their responsibilities. Penalties to the Borough can be as much as \$37,500/day.

LED Streetlight Procurement

Construction is expected to be late spring/early summer 2017.

842/844 Main St.

May 2017 marks 4 years since the fire occurred. Has anything been submitted by Mr. Healy regarding improving the site so the adjacent property owner can resolve their issues? The adjacent property owner has a sump pump connected to the sanitary sewer and it needs to be disconnected. It should be done as part of their building envelope improvement.

Demolitions

- 143 N. 9th Street the demolition grant application has been submitted to the County. OHCD indicates funding is limited at this time. The project will be included in the list provided to County Council for consideration during the FY 17 program review.
- 611 Walnut Street We are unaware of the status.
- 313 Darby Terrace The CDBG demolition application was submitted on 2/28/17. Additional information is required to have a complete application. Upon receipt, we will forward the remaining pieces to the County.

Sanitary Sewer Grant Funds

The PA Small Water and Sewer Grant awardees were announced. Of the more than 600 applications submitted, 116 projects were approved. Five in Delaware County received awards. Unfortunately, Darby Borough was not selected. The principal reason given was that there were

just so many more applications than funds available. Another round is approved for release between August 1 – October 31, 2017. The Director of the grant does not yet know what the funding level will be.

EP Environmental Education Grant -

The grant application for \$3,000 for the purchase and installation of storm drain markers was submitted to DCED on December 15, 2016. All awards will be announced on or around Earth Day, April 22, 2017.
