### **Current Month Activity:**

## Ordinary Street and Sewer Maintenance

Commerce Street Sanitary Sewer: Gargiule will be excavating to remove a plug from the main sewer. A to U will televise following that to determine the extent of sewer repair needed.

## Grants

2021 CDBG: The Borough has been awarded grant funds in the amount of \$238,299.00 to make sanitary sewer improvements on 13<sup>th</sup> Street from Main Street to the Darby Creek. We expect authorization to proceed with bids in the Fall.

2018 PA Small Water and Sewer Grant – project not started; grant expiration extension has been obtained; grant now expires on June 30, 2022. The Borough has been awarded CDBG funds for this project that will act as the required match for this grant.

Blight Remediation Grant: The Borough has been awarded grant funding in the amount of \$300,000.00 for the demolition of 621 Main Street and 304 Marks Avenue. NDI is preparing the bid packages for this project. Structures, Inc. is preparing the drawings for the stabilization of 306 Marks Avenue, and we are seeking an easement from the owner of the parking lot at the corner of 6<sup>th</sup> and Main Streets to provide access for the demolition equipment to 621 Main Street.

County Demolition Fund: NDI is preparing the application for County Demolition Funding to demolish 901-905 Springfield Road. Due to the proximity to the Darby Creek, DEP permits will be required. The County Demolition Fund has a funding limit of \$85,000/structure. The estimated cost for demolition of the site is \$150,000. The Borough and Structures, Inc. will be inspecting the interior next week to determine if there is a party wall, and the extent of the structural wall damage. If there is a party wall, there would be sufficient funds available to demolish the building. If not, significant additional funds would be needed.

#### Stormwater Tip:

Sediment from construction activities clouds waterways and interferes with the habitat of living things that depend upon those waters.
