Current Month Activity:

Ordinary Street and Sewer Maintenance

A to U dye tested the voids on Main St between 12th and 13th and the dye appeared in the sanitary sewer. They will be removing debris from the manholes and then televising the line to determine the condition. They did to the storm sewer, and while the video has not yet been received, they reported the storm sewer was in good condition.

Liquid Fuels

A motion to adopt a Resolution requesting the Borough's 2022 County Aid allocation from the County would be appropriate tonight.

An ordinance must be passed by Borough Council that has the Borough adopt Londonderry Lane, Coventry Avenue, Shetland Road, and Glen Cove Road. If the Borough adopts these streets, than they can receive additional liquid fuels funds for the mileage of these streets.

Grants

CFA Local Share Grant (Statewide): The Borough's application for grant funding to replace the sanitary sewer main and street laterals on North 2nd St. was submitted to DCED on 3/15/22. A motion for Council to adopt a Resolution authorizing the Council President and Borough Manager to be signatories for any grant received is needed this evening.

2021 CDBG: The Borough has been awarded grant funds in the amount of \$238,299.00 to make sanitary sewer improvements on 13th Street from Main Street to the Darby Creek. Bid specs will be advertised next week in time for Council's consideration for an award at the April meeting.

2022 CDBG: The Borough's application to do street improvements on 14th St between Main St. and the Darby Creek was submitted on January 7, 2022. The County Council will likely announce awards in April 2022.

2018 PA Small Water and Sewer Grant – this project is also being funded by the 2021 CDBG program; we expect to bid this during March 2022. The Borough received an extension to the grant performance period through October 31, 2022.

Blight Remediation Grant: The demolition of 304 Marks Ave is beginning this week. The contractor with notifications for utility shut-offs, temporary fencing, and ordering of dumpsters. The contractor is working with CSX to obtain a permit to use the parking lot at 6th/Main for a staging site for the demolition of 621 Main St. The Borough has requested consideration by the CFA to add the exterior stabilization of 141 Whitely Terrace to the grant scope of work.

Stormwater Tip:

Faulty sanitary sewer mains and laterals may cause sewer overflows onto roadways. These sewer overflows may result in raw sewage reaching storm inlets and ultimately discharge to a water body within the Commonwealth. It is a property owner's responsibility to maintain the lateral, and the Borough's responsibility to maintain the street main. Please be aware of signs that an issue is occurring within the lateral; evidence of an overflow at the trap is a sign of a problem at either the street or house lateral, or the connection of the laterals at the trap. If a resident hears gurgling when flushing a toilet or sees evidence of a backup into the home, the sewer lateral requires attention.

February Chief's Report

Dear Mr. President, Board of Directors and general membership,

During the month of February, the company responded to 80 calls for service, 4 of them being working fires. Of the working fires, (1) was located in Chadds Ford, (1) was located in Yeadon Borough, (1) was located in Collingdale Borough and (1) was located in Upper Darby Township.

On February 8th, Co 4 was redirected from a cover assignment at Sta. 59 to the fire scene on the 200 block of Harvey Rd in Chadds Ford. E4 assisted on scene with overhaul of the building. E4 operated for just under an hour before being released to cover Co. 59's local. Station 4 was staffed with a crew for the Truck in quarters. **NO FF INJURIES WERE REPORTED**

On February 13th, Co 4 was dispatched to the 200 block of Jackson Ave in Collingdale for a reported house fire. E4 arrived as the first engine and located a small fire involving the washer and dryer in the basement. E4 performed fire suppression while the truck companies checked for extension. Co. 4 worked on scene for an hour and 15 minutes before being released by command. **NO FF INJURIES REPORTED**

On February 17th, Co 4 was dispatched to the 300 block of Baily Rd in Yeadon for a reported house fire. First arriving units encountered fire conditions on the first floor of the home, E4 arrived and assisted with fire suppression and overhaul. Co 4 worked on scene for just under 2 hours before being released by command. **NO FF INJURIES REPORTED**

On February 18th, Co 4 was special called to assist UDFD on a house fire on the 200 block of Heather Rd. E4 arrived and assisted with overhaul for 30 minutes before being released to cover the Township. Station 4 was staffed with a crew for the Truck in quarters. ** NO FF INJURIES WERE REPORTED**
