Ms. Davis called the Committee Meeting to order.

**ROLL CALL** 

Ms. Davis discussed the turkey giveaway on November 19<sup>th</sup>. Mrs. Williams gave the attached report. There was a discussion from Wanda about her program reconnect and using the Recreation Center as a venue. Mrs. DeShields asked about fundraisers in December. There was multiple discussions about relocating activities for the recreation center due to the renovations that are taking place.

#### Recreation Committee Report for November 2nd 2022

Starting November 15th 2022, Everyone entering the Rec center needs to register at the front office. A waiver needs to be signed by everyone. Seventeen and younger must be signed by a legal guardian. A school ld or driver's license will be held until you sign out. We are requesting these changes to provide a safe haven for all our guests. All hoodies should be down and face masks removed when entering the building. You may put your face mask back on upon checking in. All non profits and rentals must check in at the window. Absolutely no weapons are allowed in or around the rec center, police station and borough Hall property.

The activity/community room should be up and running by Feb 1st or sooner. At this time Everyone must have a membership or a day/guest pass to enter the building.

Fees/Pricing has not been determined at this time.

These charges are to cover the maintenance or replacement of games, cleaning, sanitizing, security, different hands on programs, membership card/ app or some kind of system, and continually updating the rec.

Food will be served for a small fee. Kids 10 and younger will eat for free with a ticket/voucher.

Seniors will pay half price.

For our nightly programs, you will be allowed 15 minutes to enter the building before the doors are locked. A bell has been placed outside the door if you arrive late.

The Recreation Center will be under renovations beginning Nov, 9th to provide a better experience for our residents.

We are also asking if some of the covid money can be used to renovate the kitchen to a commercial kitchen.

 Keeping the current cabinets. Just paint and add some new knobs for better look



- Installation of plumbing to add a separate hand washing sink and double sinks for washing and rinsing
  - New dishwasher
  - New counter top
  - Shelving around the walls.
    - New refrigerators
  - Two commercial freezer for the back storage area
    - A new stove with exhaust install.
  - A sliding style front window that locks for kitchen and anything else that's needed to get the kitchen up to code.

Locks will be installed on the outside of bathroom doors.

Paper towels will be removed from the bathrooms.

Baby changing table will be coming to the women's bathroom.

Plumbing will be repaired in both bathrooms

A receptacle bin will be added to the women's restroom for the disposal of sanitary napkins and

Toilet seat covers.

Food giveaway will be assorted in boxes for the community to grab and go.

We are still working and brainstorming on ideas to bring to the community.

Also we are requesting for council approval on a bidding of a professional cleaning company to clean and sanitize the borough Hall, the police station and the rec center after hours.

Also we need 2 clocks.

One in the gym and one in the community room.
